An Act to change the name of Laura Calista Jenkins to Mary Frances Bullard.

Chap. 10.

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. That the name of Laura Calista Jenkins shall hereafter be Mary Frances Bullard, by which name she shall be known to all intents and purposes.

SEC. 2. The said person whose name is thus changed by section first of this act shall be the child and heir at law of John Bullard, Junior, of Kenosha county, State of Wisconsin, and the obligation of child to parent and parent to child shall pertain as fully between the parties herein mentioned as in the case of natural parentage and descent.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

An Act relating to the repeal of Statutes.

Chap 11.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. No suit at law, or criminal prosecution, now pending, or which shall hereafter be commenced, founded upon any statute of this state, shall be defeated by a repeal of such statute; but such suit or prosecution shall proceed to issue, trial and final judgment, in the same manner and to the same purpose and effect, as though the statute upon which the same is, or shall be founded,

Chap. 12. An Act to provide for the collection of delinquent taxes in the town of Willow Springs, in LaFayette county, for the year 1849.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

To collect tax
of 1849.

SECTION 1. The treasurer of the town of Willow Springs, in the county of LaFayette, is authorized and required to receive from the county treasurer of said county the warrant and tax list of the said town, for the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and proceed to the collection of all taxes due and unpaid on said tax list according to law.

SEC. 2. Said treasurer shall make return of the warrant to the county treasurer according to the provisions of law within thirty days after the time he shall receive the same, and the county treasurer shall proceed to sell the lands for delinquent taxes, in the manner now provided by law.

Chap. 13. An act authorizing the Register of Deeds of LaFayette county, to correct the recorded plat of the village of White Oak Springs, and to provide for the collection of delinquent taxes therein

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Register to cor-
rect plat.

SECTION 1. The register of deeds of the county of LaFayette is hereby authorized and required to alter and correct the recorded plat of the village of White Oak Springs, in said county, so that said recorded plat shall designate and describe said village of White Oak Springs, as situated upon the west half of the north east quarter, of section number thirty-two, in town one, north of range number
