

tees, and shall have power to establish, conduct and continue at or near the city of Milwaukee, a Female Seminary, and to devise and execute measures for the management and prosperity thereof; to prescribe the course of study in the several departments thereof; to appoint requisite teachers and tutors, and also to confer such degrees, and to grant and issue such diplomas as are usually conferred and granted in Female Seminaries. The said board of trustees shall also have power to appoint an executive committee, consisting of the president, secretary and treasurer and three members, for the transaction of all ordinary business under the direction of the by-laws, and subject to the approval of the board of trustees.

Sec. 4. All funds and property received by the board of trustees by gift or otherwise, shall be faithfully applied by them to the best of their judgment for the benefit of the Seminary in the purchase or rent of grounds or buildings, procuring library and apparatus, furniture and fixtures, creating endowments for the payment of teachers, and in the payment of the necessary and proper expenses of the said corporation: *Provided, however,* That any donation or bequest made for particular purposes in accordance with the design of the corporation hereby created, shall be applied according to the wishes of the donor and the terms of the bequest. How funds applied.

Sec. 5. The library, apparatus, cabinet, buildings and lands, not exceeding five acres, belonging to the corporation hereby created, shall be exempt from taxation: *Provided,* That lands exempted from taxation by the provisions of this act shall not be used for any other than Seminary purposes. Property exempt from taxation.

Sec. 6. This act shall take effect immediately.

An Act to appropriate to Chauncey Abbott and to Leonard J. Farwell the sums of money therein named.

Chap 119

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to Chauncey Abbott, Post Master, at Madison, the sum of two thousand

eight hundred and eighty-seven dollars and seventy-two cents, for postage of the members of the legislature, from January 14th to March 4th, 1852, to be paid out of any money in the state treasury.

SEC. 2. There is hereby appropriated to Leonard J. Farwell, Governor, the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars, out of any money in the state treasury, to be paid by him to Chauncey Abbott, Post Master at Madison, for postage of the members of the legislature after the 4th day of March, A. D. 1852, on accounts audited by the proper committee of the legislature, or otherwise established to his satisfaction.

Chap 120

An Act to authorize the laying out a State Road therein described.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Jacob Rogers, D. D. Billings and William Ward, be, and are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out and establish a state road commencing at Packwankee in Marquette county, thence running in a westerly direction to Davis' tavern on the Pinery road leading from Fort Winnebago to Grand Rapids; thence to cross the Wisconsin river at or near where the town line crosses said river between town fourteen and fifteen; thence to Carpenter's and Rogers' mills on the Lemonware river in Sauk county; and thence to intersect the state road leading from Dutton in Sauk county to Prairie La Crosse, at or near Maugh's mill on the Lemonwoir river in Adams county.

SECTION 2. The commissioners shall receive for their services such compensation as may be allowed by the board of supervisors of the counties through which said road may pass: *Provided*, That no part of the expense of laying out said road shall be paid out of the state treasury.
