An Act to authorize the village of Manitowor to maintain a bridge across the Manitowor Chap 121 River.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Snate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The bridge across the Manitowoc river, on Bridge to be Eighth Street, in the village of Manitowoc, shall be the property of property, repaired, rebuilt, maintained, and tended, at the expense of said village.

SEC. 2. The said (*village*) [bridge] shall be and forever remain free of toll, and a suitable draw shall be constructed How constructin the same, to admit the passage of any water craft navizating said river, without any unnecessary delay.

SEC. 3. To carry into effect the foregoing provisions, the president and trustees of said village are hereby author-May lovy tax. ized to raise the necessary sum or sums of money, by tax upon the taxable property of said village, to be levied and collected in the same manner as other taxes authorized by law are levied and collected.

An Act to authorize the laying out a State Road therein described.

Chap 122

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Sunate and Assembly do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Joel S. Fish, Randall Johnson, and Mickel John, be and are hereby appointed commissioners to lay ^{Commissioners.} out and establish a state road, commencing at the town of Green Bay, in Brown county, and running thence, on the most direct and practicable route to Shioc, on section number twenty-nine, in township number twenty-three, north of range number sixteen east; thence across Wolf river, at said point, upon a westerly course, on the best and most direct route to Plover Portage, in Portage county.

SEC. 2. The commissioners shall receive such compen-tou. eation for their services as may be allowed by the board of supervisors of the counties through which such road shall pass: *Provided*, That no part of the expense of laying out
