Chap 268

An Act to legalize and establish a public highway therein named.

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Established a public highway.

SECTION 1. The public highway heretofore laid out by the joint action of the supervisors of the town of Oregon, in Dane county, and the town of Brooklyn, in Green county, upon the county line between said counties and within said towns, commencing in the state road leading from New Albany in Green county, to Wm. Quivey's in Dane county; thence west on said county line to the west line of said township, is hereby established at three rods wide, and the same is hereby declared a public highway of that width.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

Chap 269

An Act to legalise a State Road therein named.

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Declared legal highway. Section 1. The state road laid out and established from the house of S. B. Newcomb, on the north-east quarter of section thirty, town seven, of range nine east, in the county of Dane; thence as laid out by the commissioners appointed by act of the legislature, approved March 11th, 1851, to Mineral Point, in Iowa county, by way of Blue Mounds, is hereby declared to be a legal highway on the line and route so established by said commissioners.

Supervisors to open read.

SEC. 2. The town supervisors are hereby authorized and required to proceed to open said road immediately through each town in which any part of said road may run.

SEC. 3. This act shall be in force after its passage.
