

An Act to provide for the appointment of commissioners to select and appraise school lands. Chap 490

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The governor is hereby authorized and empowered to appoint from one to three commissioners to select and appraise whatever may remain to be selected of the five hundred thousand acres of land granted to this state by act of Congress, approved Sept. 4th, 1841. Governor to appoint commissioners.

SEC. 2. The said commissioners so appointed, shall, before entering upon the duties required of them by this act, take and subscribe an oath of office as required in section twenty-eight, of article four, of the constitution, before some person authorized to administer oaths, and transmit the same to the governor, who shall cause the same to be filed in the office of the secretary of state. To take oath.

SEC. 3. Said commissioners shall act under the direction of the governor in making selections of said lands, and shall make monthly returns of such lands selected by them to the governor, they shall also make returns to the land offices of the district in which any lands selected by them are situated, as soon after such selection as may be practicable. To make returns.

SEC. 4. Said commissioners, in appraising said lands, shall be governed by the provisions of sections four and five of an act of the legislature entitled "an act providing for the appraisal and subdivisions of the school and university lands," approved August 12th, 1848. How appraisers governed.

SEC. 5. The said commissioners shall each receive three dollars for each and every day actually and necessarily spent in performing the duties required by this act, and they shall certify under oath the number of days so spent by them. Compensation.
