Chap 496

An Act to amend chapter twenty of the Session Laws of 1849.

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do chart of follows:

Bead districts.

SECTION 1. Those portions of the towns of Lake, Greenfield, Oak Creek, and Franklin, lying on each side of the town line which separates Greenfield, Lake, and Franklin from Oak Creek, extending one hundred and sixty rods on each side of said line from east to west and from north to south the whole length of the towns of Lake, Greenfield, and Oak Creek, and three hundred and twenty rods west of said line, in the town of Franklin, as far as said road extends, is hereby established, constituted, and divided into four road districts, to wit: one between the towns of Lake and Greenfield, and three between the towns of Oak Creek and Franklin.

SEC. 2. The district in the towns of Lake and Greenfield shall be called Kilbourn road district number one; the first district in the towns of Oak Creek and Franklin, extending from the north line of said towns south two miles, shall be called Kilbourn road district number two: the second district, extending from the south line of district number two south two miles, shall be called Kilbourn road district number three; and the third district, extending from the south line of said towns of Franklin and Oak Creek north two miles, shall be called Kilbourn road disirict number four.

The overseer of highways for said district How overseers SEC. 3. shall be elected as provided in chapter twenty, section three, in the session laws of 1849.

SEC. 4. The road overseers of said Kilbourn road dis-Overseers to di tricts number two, three, and four shall meet at some convenient place, and they shall divide the tools of said districts into three equal shares, and each of said districts number two, three, and four shall receive one share.

SEC. 5. All acts and parts of acts contravening the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

The judge of the county court of the county of St. Croix, in this state, is hereby authorized and empowered to make and perfect the records and entries of all perfect, records. proceedings in the settlement of estates of deceased persons had before the late judge of the county court of said county, Hamlet II. Perkins, deceased, and to make and [perfect] all other entries and proceedings had before said Hamlet H. Perkins, sitting as judge of the probate court, as the truth of the facts may appear to be; and the records of all such entries and proceedings so made shall have the same force and effect and be as valid for all purposes as if such record had been made by the said Hamlet II. Perkins, judge as afore-aid.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication.
