AN ACT to change the time for holding the fall term of the Circuit Court of Calumet County.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Change of
term time.

SECTION 1. The fall term of the circuit court for the county of Calumet, in the fourth judicial circuit in this State, shall hereafter be holden on the second (2d) Monday in November, instead of the first Monday in November, as now provided by law.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage; and all acts and parts of acts contravening the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed.

AN ACT to prevent obstructions on the Wisconsin river.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

How bridges
to be built.

SECTION 1. All bridges hereafter to be erected on the Wisconsin river, shall be built and constructed at no greater variation than five degrees from right angles with the current of said river; the superstructure of the same shall be at least six feet above high water mark, with spans of not less than one hundred and fifty feet in the clear, between the piers, and shall have a draw of not less than fifty feet over the main channel of said river; and said piers shall be so constructed as to stand parallel with the current of the river.

SEC. 2. All bridges, and other improvements hereafter to be constructed on said river, and for which acts of incorporation have been obtained through the legislature, shall be erected and constructed in such manner as not to interfere with the main channel of said

river, but shall be so constructed as to leave said channel open for the free passage of boats, rafts and other craft, without hindrance, damage or delay: *Provided*, This act shall not be construed so as to effect chapter 335 of the private laws of 1855, authorizing the trustees of Sauk City to construct a bridge across the Wisconsin river at Sauk City.

SEC. 3. All acts and parts of acts contravening the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed. Repealed.

SEC. 4. This act shall be in force from and after its passage and publication.

Chapter 14.

~~An~~ Act to legalize certain Roads therein named, and declaring the same to be State Roads.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The action of board of supervisors of the county of Juneau, in the appointment of commissioners to lay out a road from Germantown, in a north westerly direction to the north line of said county, and also to lay out a road from the village of Necedah, via New Lisbon to Wonowoc, is hereby declared to be legalized, and the actions of said commissioners are also declared legalized, and said roads so laid out by said commissioners, upon said commissioners complying with the laws in relation to State roads, shall be considered and declared State roads as fully, and to all intents and purposes, as if laid out by an act of the legislature. Legalized and declared State roads.

SEC. 2. This act shall be in force, and shall take effect from and after its passage.
