An Act to amend Chapter 115 of the Session Laws of 1856, entitled "An Act to provide for the Annual Examination of the Accounts of certain Officers."

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Amendment.

SECTION 1. That section one, of chapter one hundred and fifteen of the Session Laws of 1856, is hereby amended so as to read as follows: A joint standing committee, consisting of one member of the Senate, and two members of the Assembly, to be called the committee for investigation, shall be elected or appointed at the commencement of each annual session of the legislature, whose duty it shall be to examine the reports of the Secretary of State, State Treasurer, Commissioners of the School, University and Swamp Lands, Bank Comptroller, Superintendent of Public Instruction, and Superintendent of Public Property, for the year next preceding, and all books, records, accounts and vouchers of said officers respectively pertaining to the condition and management of the State Treasurer, and of all property, lands and funds in charge of said officers, or any or either of them, during said year, and all the business transacted by said officers respectively pertaining to their respective offices or departments, from the date of said reports to the first day of the session of the legislature of which such committee shall have been elected or appointed, and they shall report the result of such examination to the legislature at any time at least one week previous to its final adjournment.

SEC. 2. This act shall be immediately published by the State Printer, and shall then take effect and be in force.
