

## Chapter 79.

*Published May 8th, 1858.*

AN ACT to repeal Chapter ninety-two of Session Laws of 1856, entitled "An Act to amend Chapter seventy-one of the Revised Statutes being an act in relation to divorces."

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :*

**Repealed.**

SECTION 1. Chapter ninety-two of the session laws of 1856, entitled "an act to amend chapter seventy-nine of the Revised Statutes," shall be, and the same is hereby repealed.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## Chapter 80.

*Published May 10th, 1858.*

AN ACT relating to injunctions in certain cases.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows ;*

In case where railroad companies have appropriated lands, &c., to their use, without remuneration, persons may by writ of injunction, stop running of cars, &c.

SECTION 1. In all cases where, at the time of the passage of this act, any railroad company in this State shall have taken or appropriated, or where any such company shall take and appropriate for right of way, depot grounds or for the use of such company in any manner whatever, any lands or real estate owned by or belonging to any person resident in this State, and for which such person is or may be entitled to compensation from such railroad company, and such company shall have failed, neglected or refused for the space of six months after having taken or appropriated the same, by making and the laying of its track thereon, to make and pay such compensation to the person entitled thereto, the person so entitled may, by writ of injunction or
