

William B. and Julia Brond, and of each of them, their child and heir at law, and the same obligations, duties and liabilities for support, maintenance, nurture, control and obedience shall devolve upon the said parties respectively as though they were natural parents of said child.

CHAPTER 223.

AN ACT to amend chapter 24, of the general laws of 1859, entitled "An act to amend chapter 18, of the revised statutes, entitled 'Of assessment and collection of taxes.'"

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section two, of chapter 24, of the general laws of 1859, entitled "an act to amend chapter 18, of the revised statutes, entitled of the assessment and collection of taxes," is hereby amended so as to read as follows: The state treasurer shall charge such returned taxes against the lands to which they belong, and if the said taxes are not paid on or before the first day of June next succeeding, he shall add thereto twenty-five per cent., which twenty-five per cent. shall be collected with other charges against said lands, and when collected shall be added to the principal of the appropriate fund, and if there shall be no monies due from any such county to the state, the state treasurer shall pay the amount of such delinquent taxes to the county treasurer by whom the same shall have been returned, out of the appropriate fund in the treasury.

SEC. 2. Such parts of any and all acts as contravene the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force and after its passage.
