### CHAPTER 84.

AN ACT to remit to the county of Dodge the penalty charged for delinquency in the payment of state tax of 1857.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. The sum of four hundred and twenty dollars and fifty-seven cents, the amount of the twenty-five per cent penalty charged to the county of Dodge for the delinquency in the payment of the state tax of the year 1857, on the first day of October, 1858, by the secretary of state in accordance with the provisions of sections one and two of chapter 152 of the general laws of 1858, be and the same is hereby remitted to said county, and the secretary of state and state treasurer are hereby directed to make the necessary entries to the credit of said county.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

### CHAPTER 85.

AN ACT to provide for the payment of certain accounts for newspapers.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. The secretary of state is hereby authorized to audit the accounts of the several newspaper publishers for papers furnished to the legislature during the present session, and to settle such accounts, allowing said publishers at the rates at which said newspapers respectively are furnished to subscribers at the places of publication.

SEC. 2. Such accounts shall be verified by the oath of the persons furnishing the newspapers, that the papers were ordered either by the chief clerk or the person to whom they were sent and furnished, and that the said accounts are just and true as to number and price, as provided in the preceding section of this act.

SEC. 3. The secretary of state is hereby authorized
