

teen and sixteen east; thence north on said range line to the township line between townships twenty-five and twenty-six north; thence west on said township line to the range line between ranges twelve and thirteen east; thence north on said range line to the township line between townships twenty-seven and twenty-eight north; thence west on said township line to the range line between ranges nine and ten east; thence south on said range line to the township line between townships twenty-five and twenty-six north; thence east on said township line to the range line between ranges ten and eleven east.”

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 9.

AN ACT for the compensation of the officers of the legislature for the year 1859.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Compensation
of officers.

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, a sum sufficient to pay the per diem of the officers of the legislature, as hereinafter provided, to wit: To the chief clerks, each five dollars; to the assistant clerks, each three dollars; to all other clerks, sergeant-at-arms, and their assistants, and postmasters, each two dollars and fifty cents; to assistant postmasters, door-keepers and firemen, each two dollars; and to messengers, each one dollar per day.

SEC. 2. The per diem hereby established, shall only be allowed from the commencement to the adjournment of the Legislature, and each of the officers mentioned in this act is hereby authorized to receive his per diem from the treasury on the certificate of the presiding officers of their respective houses as to the number of days attendance.

SEC. 3. This act shall be in force from and after its passage.
