GENERAL LAWS .--- OHAPTER 200.

CHAPTER 200.

[Published March 27, 1860.]

AN ACT to discontinue the survey and selection of swamp and overflowed lands in this State,

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The surveying, platting, selecting and ex-survey disamining of swamp and overflowed lands in this State continued. shall be and are hereby discontinued, and no further expense shall be incurred on account thereof, until the general government shall formally recognize the claim of this State to the swamp and overflowed lands lying within the State, as shown by the surveys made by the authority and at the expense of the State, and which were not returned on the plats of the General Land Office as such.

SEC. 2. The Governor is hereby authorized, and re-Duties of govquired, to cause copies of the plats and surveys hereto-ernor. fore made by the authority and at the expense of this State, to be laid before the Surveyor General of Iowa and Wisconsin, and to furnish copies, and cause the same to be presented, to the Commissioners of the General Land Office, as provided by section 2, of the act of Congress, entitled "An act for the relief of purchasers and locators of swamp and overflowed lands," approved March 2, 1855.

SEC. 3. The Governor is also authorized to draw and Governor to receive from the treasurer of the United States, all such receive monsums of money as may be justly due from the United ^{eys from U.S.} States, or which are now acknowledged to be due, by the authorities of the United States to this State, on account of the disposal of any such lands, and pay the money so received into the treasury of this State.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
