

CHAPTER 298. different sum than sufficient to pay for the paper specified in the duplicate order, filed in the Secretary's office by the chief clerk of the Assembly, and that no such account shall be audited for or on account of any member, officer or employee of the Senate, for a greater sum or different sum than sufficient to pay for the papers specified in the duplicate order filed in the Secretary's office by the chief clerk of the Senate; and in no case shall the amount so audited exceed a sum sufficient to pay for nine daily newspapers, or their equivalent in weekly newspapers, to each such member, officer and employee.

Secretary authorized to draw warrants.

Appropriation.

§ 3. The Secretary of State is hereby authorized to draw warrants on the State Treasury, in favor of the persons respectively to whom such accounts are found due for newspapers; and there is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated, a sum sufficient to pay the same.

§ 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 298.

AN ACT to appropriate a certain sum of money to the joint committee on States Prison.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

Appropriation to committee of Legislature on State Prison.

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of twenty-five dollars, to each of the following named persons, to-wit: A. Alden, W. W. Blackman, Clarkson Miller, F. W. Horn, Jos. Rankin, O. F. Bartlett, Fred. Hilgen, M. D. Seeley, members of the committee on the State's Prison of the Assembly and Senate, for visiting the State's Prison and the State Reform School, and examining and investigating the affairs and accounts of the same.

§ 2. This act shall be in force from and after its passage.
