

CHAPTER 6.

[Published January 25, 1860.]

AN ACT to legalize the official acts of Edward O'Hare, as justice of the peace in the county of Dane.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. That all the official acts and duties performed by Edward O'Hare, as justice of the peace, in the town of Vermont, in the county of Dane, in this State, prior to the passage of this act, so far as the same are consistent with the general laws of this State, are hereby legalized, and declared to be as valid, for all purposes, as though the said Edward O'Hare had caused his official bond and oath to be made and filed, in conformity with the statutes of this State.

Legalizing the official acts of Edward O'Hare, J. P., Dane county.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 7.

AN ACT to legalize the official acts of August B. Erbe, as justice of the peace in the county of Dane.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. That all the official acts and duties performed by August B. Erbe, as justice of the peace, in the town of Vermont, in the county of Dane, in this State, prior to the passage of this act, so far as the same are consistent with the general laws of this State, are hereby legalized and declared to be as valid, for all purposes, as though the said August B. Erbe had caused his official bond or bonds, and oath or oaths, to be made and filed, in conformity with the statutes of this State.

Legalizing the official acts of August B. Erbe, J. P., Dane county.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
