

CHAPTER 208.

[Published April 15, 1861.]

AN ACT to legalize the official acts of N. Frank, as Justice of the Peace of the county of Winnebago.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. All the official acts of N. Frank, who was duly elected in April, 1860, as justice of the peace for the term of two years, in the town and village of Omro, in the county of Winnebago, are hereby legalized and made as valid during said term, as if the said Frank had complied with all the requirements of the statute before entering upon the duties of said office.

Official acts of N. Frank, J. P., legalized.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 209.

[Published April 13, 1861.]

AN ACT for the better protection of log owners on the Chippewa river.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. Every person owning or rafting logs on the Chippewa river shall, in all cases, so raft them that the "marks" thereon shall be on the upper side of every log when rafted, and open to view and inspection by all persons interested.

Marks—where to be.

SECTION 2. Every person offending against the provisions of section one of this act, shall forfeit and pay the sum of one dollar for each log so rafted, to be recovered in any court of competent jurisdiction, to and for the use of the complainant.

Penalty.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication.
