

CHAPTER 44.

[Published February 28, 1861.]

AN ACT to extend the time for the collection of taxes in the city of Janesville.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The time for the collection and return ^{Time extended.} of the state and county taxes in the city of Janesville, Rock county, is hereby extended until the twenty-eighth day of March, A. D. 1861, and the tax warrant now in the hands of the city treasurer, shall be in full force until the said twenty-eighth day of March, A. D. 1861, for all the purposes of collecting, levying distress and sale, and returning said taxes.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 45.

AN ACT for the relief of the town of Eldorado, in the county of Fond du Lac.

Whereas, The books, papers and records of the town ^{Preamble.} of Eldorado have been destroyed by the burning of the office of the town clerk of said town, and the people thereof have been thus left destitute of any proper evidence of the existence of public highways, or the boundaries of school districts therein : therefore,

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. All roads heretofore surveyed and used ^{Of roads.} as public highways in said town of Eldorado (excepting such as may have been discontinued by the proper authorities) are hereby declared to be public highways.

SECTION 2. It shall be the duty of the supervisors ^{Of the re-survey of roads.} of said town, and they are hereby required, as soon as
