

CHAPTER 169.

[Published April 1, 1862.]

AN ACT to amend section five of chapter 66 of the revised statutes, entitled "of corporations."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. That section 5 of chapter 66 of the revised statutes, be amended by striking out the words "the clerk of the board of supervisors," where the same occurs [occur] in said section, and inserting the words "the register of deeds." By whom certificate to be recorded.

SECTION 2. All bonds and files relating to any incorporation, now in the office of the clerk [clerks] of the several boards of supervisors of this state, shall, by said clerk [clerks] be immediately transmitted to the office of the register of deeds of the proper county, to be by said register preserved in a convenient form for the inspection of any and all persons interested. Bonds, &c., to be transmitted to registers of deeds.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the passage thereof.

CHAPTER 170.

[Published April 1, 1862.]

AN ACT to amend subdivision six of section 31 of chapter 134 of the revised statutes, entitled "of executions and proceedings supplementary thereto."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subdivision six of section 31 of chapter 134 of the revised statutes, entitled "of executions and proceedings supplementary thereto," is hereby amended by adding thereto the following words, to wit: one gun, rifle or other firearm, not exceeding fifty dollars in value. Additional exemptions.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 171.

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "an act to amend an act to incorporate the village of Horicon," approved March 29, 1855.

CHAPTER 172.

[Published April 1, 1862.]

AN ACT to change the time for holding the general terms of the circuit court in the county of Marquette, in the third judicial circuit, and to provide for a special term in said county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Terms of court.

SECTION 1. The general terms of the circuit court of the county of Marquette, shall hereafter be held on the third Monday in August and the third Monday in February, in each year.

Special term.

SECTION 2. On the third Monday in May, A. D. 1862, a special term of the circuit court in and for said circuit, shall be held by the judge thereof, at the court house in the village of Montello, in the county of Marquette, for the transaction of any and all business that may be done at a regular term, except the trial of issues of fact by a jury.

No other notice required.

SECTION 3. No notice of the holding of said special term shall be required, other than the passage and publication of this act.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
