CHAPTER 185.

AN ACT to legalize the official acts of Robert E. Scott, as justice of the peace in and for the county of Eau Claire.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Acts legalized.

SECTION 1. That all the official acts and duties performed by Robert E. Scott, as justice of the peace in and for the county of Eau Claire, in this state, prior to the passage of this act, so far as the same are consistent with the general laws of this state, are hereby legalized, and declared to be as valid, for all purposes, as though the said Robert E. Scott had caused his official bond and oath of office to be made and filed according to law.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force

from and after its passage. Approved April 3, 1862.

CHAPTER 187.

[Published April 4, 1862.]

AN ACT to authorize the board of supervisors for the county of Door, to make out a list of grand and petit jurors in said county, for the year 1862.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Authority.

Section 1. The board of supervisors for the county of Door, are hereby authorized, at the next extra session of said board, to select from the poll lists of the different towns in said county, and make out in the manner and as provided in section three of chapter 118 of the revised statutes, a list of persons properly qualified to serve as grand and petit jurors, which list of persons, when so made out, shall be the list of grand and petit jurors for the county of Door, for the year 1862.

Section 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
