

state surgeons, heretofore appointed and commissioned by the governor to cavalry regiments raised within the state, shall be paid for the time actually employed in service under such commission, in the same manner and at the same rate of compensation as is paid by the state to second assistant surgeons appointed to infantry regiments.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

### CHAPTER 263.

[Published April 11, 1862.]

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and thirty-one of the general laws of 1862, entitled "an act to suspend the sale of certain lands mortgaged to the state, or held by volunteers."

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :*

SECTION 1. Section four of chapter one hundred and thirty-one of the general laws of 1862, is hereby amended as follows : Strike out of said section the words "third day of December, 1861," and insert in lieu thereof the words "first day of April, 1862," Amendment.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

### CHAPTER 264.

[Published April 11, 1862.]

AN ACT further to declare the rights and privileges of such persons as are or may be enrolled in the service of the country.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :*

SECTION 1. The provisions of chapter seven of the Application.

general laws passed at the extra session of the legislature of this state, commencing May 15th, 1861, and of the act to which that is amendatory, shall apply to foreclosures of mortgages by advertisement under chapter one hundred and fifty-four of the revised statutes; and whenever it shall appear by affidavit or otherwise, to the satisfaction of any judge of a court of record or court commissioner, that a mortgage is sought to be foreclosed under the provisions of said chapter one hundred and fifty-four, against any person who is a member or officer of any company, regiment, corps or division, as a volunteer in the military service of the United States or of this state, and that such person is the owner of the property on which such mortgage is so sought to be foreclosed, it shall be the duty of such judge or court commissioner to order a stay and suspension of such proceedings of foreclosure, until it shall be made to appear that such person is no longer such member or officer; and every sale made in any such foreclosure proceedings, while such order of stay or suspension is in force, shall be void: *provided*, that notice of such order be given publicly at the time of such sale.

SECTION 2. The provisions of said chapter 7, and of the act to which that is amendatory, shall not extend or apply to proceedings under chapter 151 of the revised statutes, entitled "of forcible entry and unlawful detainer," nor to any suit brought against any person for monies belonging to any school district, collected or received by such person as an officer of any such school district or town.

SECTION 3. This law shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication.
