

dollars, and two assistants, whose salary (to be fixed as above) shall not exceed six hundred dollars each. The lieutenants and assistants shall be, however, removable by the chief of the police, with the consent of the mayor.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 310.

AN ACT to amend chapter 172 of the private and local laws of 1859, entitled "an act to amend an act entitled 'an act to incorporate the city of Milwaukee, and the several acts amendatory thereof,' approved February 20, 1862, and to provide for a change in the election of street commissioners, the improvement and repair of streets, and the assessment of real and personal property in the city of Milwaukee."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Petition for

SECTION 1. Section five of chapter one hundred and seventy-two of the private and local laws of 1859, entitled "an act to amend an act entitled 'an act to incorporate the city of Milwaukee, and the several acts amendatory thereof,' approved February 20, 1852, and to provide for a change in the election of street commissioners, the improvement and repair of streets, and the assessment of real and personal property in the city of Milwaukee," is hereby amended by striking out the words "persons owning a majority of the," where they occur in the fifth and sixth lines of said section, and inserting in lieu thereof the words "a majority of the persons residing in such ward, who are owners of."

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
