by the circuit court, or as are necessary and proper for the full exercise of the powers hereby granted; but his orders may be reviewed by the circuit court, as now provided by law and by the existing practice."

CHAPTER 361.

[Published June 21, 1862.]

AN ACT authorizing the treasurer to pay for transporting troops.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The state treasurer is hereby authorized certain warand directed to receive in payment of the licenses due of M. general refrom any railroad company in this state, any legally ceivable for railauthorized warrants drawn in favor of the company offering the same, by the quartermaster general, in payment for the transportation of troops and munitions of war.

Section 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 362.

[Published June 20, 1862.]

AN ACT relating to the duties of assessors and other officers, for the year 1862.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Completion assessment rolls.

Section 1. The several assessors shall, between the first Monday of July and the first Monday of September next, make out assessment rolls and perform their other duties for the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, in the manner required by law, and have the same completed on or before the said first Monday of September next.

Equalization.

Section 2. The town and city boards of equalization shall meet on the first Monday of September next, and

perform their duties as required by law.

Abstracts.

Section 3. Each clerk of the county board of supervisors shall, on or before the fourth Monday of September next, make out and transmit to the secretary of state an abstract of the real and personal property in his county, in the manner required by law.

Apportionment.

Section 4. The secretary of state shall, immediately after receiving the abstracts in the preceding section mentioned, proceed to apportion the state taxes for the present year among the several counties, in the manner now required by law, and shall transmit a certified copy of such apportionment to the clerk of the county board of supervisors of each county.

Section 5. In case the abstract in section three mentioned, shall not be received from any county or counties by the second, Monday of October next, by the sec-
