

CHAPTER 370.

[Published June 23, 1862.]

AN ACT for the relief of Mrs. Cordelia Harvey, widow of the late governor of this state, Louis P. Harvey.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to Mrs. Cordelia Harvey, widow of the late governor of this state, Louis P. Harvey, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, a sum of money which, including two quarters' salary that may be drawn from the treasury by the legal representatives of the late governor, shall make twenty-five hundred dollars, being the full amount of salary as governor for the full term for which he was elected.

CHAPTER 371.

[Published June 18, 1862.]

AN ACT authorizing the governor to take care of the sick and wounded soldiers of the Wisconsin volunteers, and appropriating money out of the treasury for that purpose.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby set apart and appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of twenty thousand dollars, to be paid out and expended upon the order of the governor of the state, for the liquidation of the claims that have already accrued and have not been paid by the state, and also all such claims as shall hereafter accrue by authority of the governor, in the necessary care of the sick and wounded soldiers of the Wisconsin volunteers, and for carrying such sick and wounded soldiers into this state, when the same shall be proper and necessary; and the state treasurer is hereby au-
