## CHAPTER 373.

[Published June 23, 1862.]

AN ACT to amend section 29 of chapter 6 of the revised statutes, entitled "of public printing, and of the publication and distribution of statutes and other public documents."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section twenty-nine of chapter six of When general laws must be the revised statutes, is hereby amended so that the printed, &c. same shall read as follows, to wit: "The general laws of each session shall be printed and delivered to the secretary of state within sixty days after the final adjournment of the session of the legislature at which the same were enacted; and whenever there is or may be Laws passed at an extra session, the laws passed at such extra session be printed separshall be printed and bound as distinct and separate vol- ately. umes, and shall be completed and delivered within thirty days after the adjournment of the same; and for each day's delay in the delivery of said laws, or any of them, after the time fixed for the delivery thereof, the said printer shall forfeit ten dollars per day, to be deducted from his bill, in the manner provided by section twenty-one of this chapter."
