SECTION 2. Said tax shall be apportioned among and assessed upon the several counties of this state, as provided by law; and such tax shall be levied upon the taxable property of this state, real and personal, and collected and paid into the treasury, as provided by law.

Levy and collection.

SECTION 3. The secretary of state shall apportion said tax among the several counties of the state, as provided by law, on or before the second Monday of October next, and certify the same to the clerk of the board of supervisors of each of the several counties, as provided by law.

To be apportioned by secretary of state.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 140.

AN ACT to appropriate to the governor five thousand dollars, for contingent expenditures.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any \$5,000. money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) to Edward Salomon, as governor, for contingent expenditures in the office of governor, for the year 1863.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
