CHAPTER 163.

[Published April 7, 1868.]

AN ACT to legalize the proceedings of a special town meeting in the town of Metoman, Fond du Lac county, Wisconsin, held November 4th, A. D. 1862.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Proceedings and tax legalized.

SECTION 1. All the proceedings of a special town meeting in the town of Metomen, Fond du Lac county, Wisconsin, held on the fourth day of November, A. D. eighteen hundred and sixty-two, for the purpose of determining whether the town of Metomen would raise a tax (on the taxable property of said town) for the purpose of paying or refunding the money which had been paid to the "war fund committee," for the purpose of paying bounties to volunteer soldiers from said town, are hereby declared legal, and the levying and collection of the tax voted at said meeting is hereby fully authorized and legalized.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force

from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 164.

[Published April 7, 1868.]

AN ACT to provide for the better drainage and reclamation of the swamp and overflowed lands lying in the county of Calumet.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Fund may be expended at the Rips.

SECTION 1. The drainage commissioners of the counties of Calumet and Manitowoc are hereby authorized to act in conjunction, for the purpose of expending any portion of the drainage fund apportioned to said counties, or either of them, for the purpose of draining the swamp and overflowed lands in said counties, or either of them, at a point called the Rips, on the Manitowoc river, in the county of Manitowoc.
