AN ACT to authorize Thomas Hinton, B. F. Cooper, Orlando Curtis, and their associates, to construct and maintain a slide on Big Bull Falls, on the Wisconsin.

CHAPTER 36.

[Published March 5, 1863.]

AN ACT to provide for temperarily procuring the public printing.

Whereas, Carpenter and Hyer, state printers, refuse to do any more work for the state under their contract of August 25, 1862:

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Authority to commissioners.

SECTION 1. The said contract of Carpenter & Hyer, bearing date the 25th day of August, 1862, entered into between them and the state of Wisconsin, for doing the public printing, is hereby rescinded, as therein provided; and the commissioners of public printing are hereby authorized to procure the work for which said contract was let, to be done, and the materials therein mentioned to be furnished, by some other person or persons, without advertising therefor, from day to day, until the same shall be relet on advertisement.

How accounts to be audited.

Section 2. The secretary of state shall audit all bills for public printing, and for materials furnished, as provided by section 1 of this act, from the time of the refusal of the late contractors to do the state printing. until the reletting of the contract on advertisement.

Appropriation.

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated. a sum sufficient to pay the warrants drawn by the secretary of state, in pursuance of section 2 of this act.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
