AN ACT to vacate a certain alley in the first ward of the city of Milwaukee.

The people of the state of Wisconsin. represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. That the alley running through block vacated one hundred and thirty, in the first ward of the city of Milwaukee, is hereby vacated.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect from and after

its passage.

CHAPTER 47.

AN ACT to legalize the recorded plot of Jacob's addition to the village of Horicon.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The recorded plot of Jacob's addition Plot legalized to the village of Horicon, in the county of Dodge, intended to represent the division of the eastern portion of the south-west quarter of the south-west quarter of section number six, (6,) in township number eleven, (11,) north of range number sixteen (16) east, into streets, alleys, lots, blocks, and out lots, as originally plotted and recorded by the late proprietor, Benjamin F. Jacobs, is hereby legalized, and declared to be as valid and effectual for all purposes whatever, as the same would have been, had the provisions of chapter forty-seven of the revised statutes been strictly complied with in all respects, in plotting, certifying to and acknowledging said plot.

SECTION 2. All conveyances of lots or portions of Conveyances said "Jacob's addition to the village of Horicon," valid. heretofore executed by the late Benjamin F. Jacobs,
