## CHAPTER 140.

[Published March 21, 1864.]

AN ACT to legalize a special town meeting in the town of Springfield, in the county of Dane, held February 27th, 1864.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Mosting and bounty tax legalised. SECTION 1. The special town meeting of the town of Springfield, in the county of Dane, held on the 27th day of February, A. D. 1864, for the purpose of voting to raise a tax to pay extra bounties to volunteers into the military service of this state or the United States, is hereby declared legal and valid for all intents and purposes for which the same was held; and all acts done in pursuance of the vote or votes of said meeting by the officers of said town or any of them, are hereby delared valid, the same as if the law had been fully complied with in notifying and conducting said meeting; and the tax voted at said meeting shall be levied and collected the same as now provided by law.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force

from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 141.

[Published March 21, 1864.]

AN ACT to legalize the proceedings of a certain town meeting in the town of Herman, in the county of Dodge.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Meeting and bounty tax legalised. SECTION 1. All the proceedings of a town meeting held in the town of Herman, in the county of Dodge, on the fifteenth day of February, 1864, are hereby declared to be legal and valid, and the proper officers are hereby authorized to levy and collect the tax voted to be raised at such meeting to pay bounties to volunteers.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force

from and after its passage.
