

CHAPTER 178.

[Published March 31, 1864.]

AN ACT to provide for procuring from the town of Hubbard, in Dodge county, a transcript of the record of a certain highway, and for recording and filing such transcript in the town Hustisford, in said county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The town clerk of the town of Hubbard, in Dodge county, is hereby authorized and required to make out a transcript from the records of the town of Hubbard aforesaid, of all the proceedings and orders of the boards of supervisors of the towns of Hubbard and Hustisford, in Dodge county, had and made by them on the first day of December, 1849, in laying out and establishing and keeping in repair a certain highway, described as follows: "Commencing at the north-east corner of the town of Hustisford, thence west on the town line, to intersect the road leading from Hustisford to Horicon;" and to certify the same to be correct, which transcripts, when so made out and certified, shall be delivered by said town clerk to the town clerk of the town of Hustisford, who shall receive the same and record the same in the appropriate record book of the town of Hustisford, and shall file such transcript in his office.

SECTION 2. Such transcript being recorded and filed as before provided in this act, the transcript and the record thereof shall be as valid and effectual in law, to all intents and purposes, as if the same were the originals, and shall be *prima facie* evidence in any court in this state of the truth of the statements therein contained.

Validity of transcript.

SECTION 3. The highway laid out and established as stated in section one of this act, is hereby declared to be a legal highway, the same as if the orders of the supervisors laying out and establishing the same had been filed and recorded in the office of the town clerk of the town of Hustisford within three days after the day fixed for deciding upon the application for laying out the same.

Highway legalized.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 175.

[Published March 30, 1864.]

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "an act to incorporate the city of La Crosse," approved March 14, 1856.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Jury to appraise damages.

Vacancies in jury

SECTION 1. Section two of chapter five of the act of which this act is amendatory, is hereby amended, by adding at the end of said section two: "and that said jurors and each of them, before they enter upon the discharge of their said duties, shall be sworn by the judge appointing them, or by some competent officer authorized to administer oaths, and make oath that they are freeholders of said city, and are not interested in the premises proposed to be taken, and that they will faithfully and impartially discharge the trust reposed in them;" and that section four of said chapter five be amended, so as to read as follows: "If any juror or jurors so appointed shall be disqualified from acting, or shall refuse to act, the judge who appointed said juror or jurors shall appoint in his or their place, and shall administer to said juror or jurors the oath hereinbefore mentioned to him or them, and a memorandum of such substitution shall be indorsed on the precipe;"
