#### CHAPTER 243.

[Published April 15, 1884.]

# AN ACT to establish a highway in the town of Lima, in the county of Book.

#### The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. That a public highway in the town of Where highway Lima, Bock county, commencing at the Lima Center and width of road, running north and south on the quarter line of section twenty-two, in said town, thence running westerly on a line parallel with and adjoining to the north line of the Milwaukee and Prairie du Chien railroad, twenty-five chains and twenty-five links, the center of said highway to be one and one-half rods north of the north line of the aforesaid railroad, [be] and the said highway is established to be three rods wide, and the same shall be so recorded in the office of the town clerk of said town of Lima.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

#### CHAPTER 244.

[Published April 15, 1864.]

AN ACT to legalize the proceedings of a town meeting held in the town of Bristol, Dane county, on the 3d day of March, A. D. 1864.

#### The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. All the proceedings of the town meet-Meeting legaling held in the town of Bristol, Dane county, on the 3d isod. day of March, 1864, for the purpose of voting to raise a tax to pay bounties to volunteers, are hereby legalized and declared valid and binding for all intents and purposes, notwithstanding any omissions or informalities in the call for or notice of such meeting, or in the proceedings or actions at the same.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 245.

#### [Published April 15, 1864.]

AN ACT to legalize a special town meeting held in the town of Cross Plains, in the county of Dane, on the fifth day of March, 1864, for the purpose of voting a tax to pay extra bounties to volunteers.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Meeting legalized.

SECTION 1. The special town meeting of the town of Cross Plains, in the county of Dane, held on the fifth day of March, A. D. 1864, for the purpose of voting to raise, by tax, extra bounties to be paid to volunteers in the military service of this state or of the United States, and all votes, acts and resolves of said meeting concerning the offering, pledging and voting to raise such bounty money, are hereby declared legal, valid and binding in law, the same and as fully as if the said meeting had been notified and conducted in all respects in accordance with the provisions of law then in force relating to that subject; and it shall be lawful for the proper officers of said town to issue town orders, payable out of such bounty fund, in accordance with the provisions of law now in force relative thereto.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved March 81, 1864.

Town orders may be issued.
