

CHAPTER 422.

AN ACT to change the time of holding courts in the tenth judicial circuit.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The terms of the circuit court for Brown ^{General terms.} and Oconto counties, in said circuit, shall hereafter be held as follows: In the county of Brown, on the first ^{Brown county.} Monday of March, the fourth Monday of May and the fourth Monday of October, in each year; in the county ^{Oconto.} of Oconto, on the first Monday of May and the first Monday of October, in each year.

SECTION 2. The term of the circuit court of Brown ^{Special terms.} county, to be held on the first Monday of March, in each year, and the term of the said circuit court for Outagamie county, to be held, as heretofore, on the third Monday of January, in each year, shall also be special terms for the whole circuit. Any and all actions, motions, proceedings or other business now pending, or which may hereafter arise in any or either of the counties of said circuit, and not requiring a jury, may be heard, tried, determined or otherwise disposed of at either of said special terms, in the same manner and with the same force and effect as if the same were heard, tried or determined in the county wherein the same are now pending or may hereafter arise. No ^{No grand jury,} ^{Business that} ^{may be disposed} ^{of.} grand jury shall be summoned for said March term in Brown county, unless upon the order of the judge of said circuit, made and filed in the clerk's office of said county, at least fifteen days before said term. Such order so made and filed, shall be sufficient authority for such clerk to draw and summon said grand jurors, pursuant to chapter 118 of the revised statutes of this state, and the laws amendatory thereof.

SECTION 3. The special terms of said circuit court, heretofore authorized to be held in said county of Brown on the fourth Monday of January, in each year, and in said county of Outagamie on the second Monday of November, in each year, are hereby abolished.

SECTION 4. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent ^{Repeal.} with this act, are hereby repealed.
