

CHAPTER 443.

AN ACT to discontinue and change the location of a state road laid agreeably to the provisions of an act entitled "an act to authorize the laying out of a state road from Prescott, Pierce county, to a point therein named," approved April 2d, 1863.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. So much of the state road laid agreeably to the provisions of an act entitled "an act to authorize the laying out of a state road from Prescott, Pierce county, to a point therein named," approved April second, 1863, as lies east of the northeast corner of the northwest quarter of the southeast quarter of section eleven, in town twenty-six, (26,) of range twenty, (20,) is hereby discontinued.

SECTION 2. J. W. Beardsley, Jno. A. Sterritt, H. A. Jay, J. F. Maynard and L. M. Hansberger are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out and establish a state road commencing at or near the northeast corner of the northwest quarter of the southeast quarter of section eleven, (11,) in town twenty-six, (26,) of range twenty, (20,) thence to some point at the center of the road known as the Prescott and Trembelle road, in section one (1) or twelve, (12,) town twenty-six, (26,) of range twenty, (20.)

SECTION 3. Said road shall be laid out and established in conformity with the provisions of law in relation to state roads: *provided*, that no part of the expense shall be paid out of the state treasury.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
