

CHAPTER 479.

[Published May 7, 1864.]

AN ACT to annex a part of the county of Burnett to the county of Douglas.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

Townships detached from Burnett and annexed to Douglas.

SECTION 1. All of townships number forty-three, of ranges numbers twelve, thirteen, fourteen and fifteen west, in the county of Burnett, are hereby detached and set off from the county of Burnett, and annexed and attached to the county of Douglas.

Repeal.

SECTION 2. All acts and parts of acts conflicting with the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 480.

[Published May 7, 1864.]

AN ACT to authorize the county of Dunn to issue bonds for the erection of county buildings.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

Bonds to amount of \$11,000 may be issued.

SECTION 1. For the purpose of aiding in the erection of a court house and county buildings, the board of supervisors of the county of Dunn are hereby authorized to issue the bonds of said county of Dunn to an amount not exceeding the sum of twelve thousand dollars, which bonds, or the proceeds thereof, shall be applied in defraying the expenses of erecting a court house and county buildings in the county of Dunn, and for no other purpose whatever.

Denomination of bonds, interest, when payable, and how signed.

SECTION 2. Said bonds shall be of the denominations of one hundred, five hundred and one thousand dollars, respectively, in such proportions as the board of supervisors shall deem proper, with coupons attached for the

payment of interest, at a rate not exceeding seven per centum per annum, and both principal and interest shall be made payable within a period not to exceed twelve years, at the Corn Exchange bank in the city of New York, and shall be executed by the chairman of the board of supervisors of said county, and countersigned by the clerk of said board, and shall have the seal of said county thereto affixed.

SECTION 3. The board of supervisors of said county shall annually levy a tax on all the taxable property in said county, sufficient to pay the interest on all the said bonds which at the time of levying the said tax shall be outstanding, and the principal of so many of said bonds as shall mature and become payable in each year, which tax shall be called the county buildings' tax, and shall be paid in money or in the bonds and coupons then due and payable; and the said bonds and coupons whenever they shall be due and payable, shall be receivable in payment of any tax due to said county, in like manner as county orders.

SECTION 4. The clerk of the board of supervisors of said county shall keep a faithful record of the bonds of said county which may be issued under the provisions of this act, which record shall contain a statement of the number of bonds issued, and to whom, and the amount of each, respectively, and to whom [when] they will mature, and the rate of interest thereof, which record shall be open to the inspection of the public at any reasonable hour.

Record of bonds.

SECTION 5. This act shall be favorably construed to effect the purposes intended to be accomplished, and is hereby declared a public act, and shall be printed on a fly leaf attached to the bonds authorized to be issued under the provisions hereof.

Act to be favorably construed.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
