

D. 1864, for the purpose of paying extra bounties to volunteers, and attach his warrant thereto, in the same manner as provided by law for the collection of taxes, and deliver the same to the treasurer of said town.

Duty of treasurer  
—his fees.

SECTION 2. Upon receiving said list of taxes, it shall be the duty of said treasurer to give notice thereof, as required by law for the collection of taxes, and he shall attend at his office or place designated in such notice, six days, to receive said taxes, with two per cent. added for treasurer's fees.

Unpaid taxes.

SECTION 3. At the expiration of the aforesaid six days, the treasurer shall proceed to collect taxes then remaining unpaid, in the same manner as prescribed by law for the collection of other taxes, and shall add all such delinquent taxes to the delinquent taxes for state, county and town purposes, for the year 1863, and return the same as the law requires.

Idid.

SECTION 4. Should there be any of such taxes which cannot be collected by the said treasurer, where the state, county and town taxes have been previously paid upon the same property, the same shall be returned in the same manner as other taxes.

Proceedings  
legalized.

SECTION 5. The proceedings of the electors of the town of West Point, at the election held on the second day of January, 1864, are hereby legalized and declared to be valid, notwithstanding the law may not have been in all respects fully complied with.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 8.

[Published February 4, 1864.]

AN ACT to legalize the proceedings of a certain town meeting of the town of Leeds, in the county of Columbia, and to authorize the board of supervisors to levy and collect a tax.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

Town meeting  
legalized.

SECTION 1. The town meeting held in the town of Leeds, in the county of Columbia, on the 28d day of January, 1864, for the purpose of raising money to

pay a bounty to volunteers to fill the quota of said town, is hereby declared valid and legal to all intents and purposes, the same as if all the provisions of law then in force had been strictly complied with.

SECTION 2. The supervisors of said town are hereby authorized and required to levy, and the town treasurer of said town to collect, a tax sufficient to pay the town orders authorized to be issued by said town meeting.

Levy and collection of tax.

SECTION 3. The supervisors of said town are hereby authorized to levy said tax on the assessment roll of said town for the year 1863 or 1864. Any taxes which shall remain unpaid, shall be returned to the county treasurer at the same time and in the same manner that other unpaid taxes are returned.

Unpaid taxes.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 9.

[Published February 3, 1864.]

AN ACT to legalize a special town meeting of the town of Mazomanie, in the county of Dane, held on the first day of January, 1864, and the acts and proceedings of the supervisors of said town in pursuance thereof.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. The special town meeting of the town of Mazomanie, in the county of Dane, held on the first day of January, A. D. 1864, for the purpose of voting to raise, by tax, extra bounties to be paid to volunteers into the military service of this state or of the United States, and all the votes, acts and resolves of said meeting concerning the offering, pledging and voting to raise such bounty money, are hereby declared legal, valid and binding in the law, the same and as fully as if the said meeting had been notified and conducted, in all respects, in accordance with the provisions of law then in force relating to that subject.
