

CHAPTER 301.

[Published May 19, 1865.]

AN ACT to prohibit volunteer and substitute brokerage.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to be engaged in or to carry on the business of procuring volunteers or substitutes to be credited to any other draft subdistrict than the one in which the person so volunteering or becoming a substitute resides, or in any way sell or dispose of any credit to or for any locality whatever: *provided*, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to prohibit any person not subject to draft, from becoming a substitute for another who is subject to draft, or who may have been drafted within this state, or being credited to any draft subdistrict within this state, which he may select.

Broker not to procure volunteer to be credited out of his subdistrict.

Proviso.

SECTION 2. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of the preceding section, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by fine, not less than one hundred dollars nor more than one thousand dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail, not exceeding the term of six months, or by both fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court.

Penalty.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
