

connected [commenced] in the circuit court, the same may be done; and the service of process in all such cases shall be made by delivering a copy to the attorney general of the state, or leaving such copy at his office, at least twenty days before the return day thereof: *provided, always*, that no judgment rendered any in such action shall be evidence of any public debt against the state, nor shall the state be held liable to pay any such judgment, or any part thereof, or for any costs which may accrue in the prosecution thereof.

CHAPTER 93.

[Published April 21, 1866.]

AN ACT to amend sections 1 and 3 of chapter 415 of the general laws of 1865, entitled "an act to amend chapter 404 of the general laws of 1862, entitled 'an act to regulate the license and keeping of dogs,'" and to provide for the disposition of certain monéys.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Collection of delinquent personal property taxes.

SECTION 1. In addition to the remedies provided by sections 100 and 101 of chapter 18 of the revised statutes, and by other laws of this state for the collection of delinquent personal property taxes, it is hereby further provided, that the county treasurer may issue a special warrant, in any convenient and proper form, to the sheriff of his county, or to the sheriff of any other county in this state, commanding the collection of the delinquent personal property tax of any person or persons so appearing delinquent upon the books of his office. Such warrant may provide for the collection of the delinquent tax of any one or more individuals, in the discretion of the county treasurer, and may be issued at any time while said tax remains unpaid.

Execution of process.

SECTION 2. Said warrants shall have the same force and effect, and shall be executed by the officer to whom the same shall be directed in the same manner, as is

provided by law in relation to other warrants of the county treasurer for the collection of unpaid personal property taxes.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 94.

[Published April 24, 1866.]

AN ACT to authorize the use of the moneys arising from the sale of certain swamp and overflowed lands in the county of Outagamie, for drainage and other purposes, and to amend chapter 537 of the general laws of 1865, relating thereto.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. All the swamp and overflowed lands in the county of Outagamie, selected for said county by the commissioners of school and university lands, under and in pursuance of the provisions of chapter 537 of the general laws of 1865, are hereby reserved from sale by the said commissioners, as directed in said act, and the said lands shall be held subject to be disposed of in the manner provided by this act, anything in said chapter 537 to the contrary notwithstanding.

Certain lands reserved from sale under chapter 537, laws of 1865, and granted to Outagamie county.

SECTION 2. James Gilmore, Byron Douglas and Joseph H. Marston, of said county of Outagamie, are hereby appointed commissioners, to be known as "the Outagamie county swamp land commissioners," and as such they are hereby authorized and empowered to act for and on behalf of said county in the execution of the trust created by this act; and by their said name shall be capable in law of taking, holding, leasing and contracting for selling and conveying the lands, or any portion thereof, described in the first section of this act, and appropriating the moneys arising from the sale thereof, so far as may be necessary for the purposes mentioned in this act, and no further; and in that name may contract and be contracted with, sue and be sued, may have a common seal, and alter and renew the same

Commissioners to hold or convey said lands.
