CHAPTER 98.

AN ACT to provide for levying and collecting a state tax for the year 1866, of \$100,000.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

\$100,000 to be raised.

SECTION 1. There shall be levied and collected for the year 1866, a state tax of one hundred thousand dollars, for the estimated expenses of 1867, to be apportioned among and assessed upon the several counties of this state, as provided by law; and such tax shall be levied upon the taxable property of the state, real and personal, and collected and paid into the treasury, as provided by law.

Apportionment.

SECTION 2. The secretary of state shall apportion said tax among the several counties of the state, as provided by law, on or before the second Monday of October next, and certify the same to the clerk of the board of supervisors of each of the several counties, as provided by law.

Levy and collection of county indebtedness to state.

SECTION 8. The secretary of state, in addition to the certificates required by law of the amount to be levied and collected by every county for state purposes the current year, shall also specially certify to each county now indebted to the state, the amount of such indebtedness, with a view of having the same collected and paid into the state treasury with the taxes of 1866. The indebtedness specified in the certificate, shall be such as may be determined by the said secretary of state, after all just credits are allowed to each of such counties.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
