CHAPTER 105.

[Published April 15, 1867.]

AN ACT to disqualify liquor-dealers from holding the office of justice of the peace, and forbidding the holding of courts of justice, in houses where liquor is sold.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. No person whose business it is either Liquor dealers in whole or in part, personally or by agent, to sell strong, justices. spirituous, ardent or intoxicating liquors, to be drank on the premises, shall be eligible to or qualifiel to hold the office of justice of the peace, and all such persons are hereby prohibited from acting as such officers.

SECTION 2. No court of justice shall be held in any Justice's court house in which, or in places appertaining thereto, in building in strong, spirituous, ardent or intoxicating liquors are which liquor is sold, bartered or given away.

SECTION 3. All acts or parts of acts conflicting Repealed. with the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

AN ACT to amend chapter 16 of the general laws of 1867, entitled "an act to provide for the purchase of Webster's dictionary, for the supply of school districts of the state."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter sixteen of the Amendment. general laws of 1867 is hereby amended, so as to read as follows: "The state superintendent of public instruction, with the consent and approval of the governor, is hereby authorized to purchase on behalf of the
