Section 2. Section one of chapter 118 of the general laws of 1858, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

#### AN ACT to provide for expenditures authorized by the resolutions therein named.

## The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The secretary of state is hereby author- For printing laws in pamized and required to audit the accounts for expendi- phlet form. tures under and in pursuance of the following resolutions of the senate and assembly, to wit: No. 18 (S.,) and No. 32 (A.,) relative to the publication of the laws in pamphlet form.

There is hereby appropriated out of Appropriation. SECTION 2. any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, belonging to the general fund, a sum sufficient

to pay the accounts authorized by this act to be audited.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

# CHAPTER 157.

[Published April 19, 1867.]

AN ACT to amend section 15 of chapter 133 of the revised statutes, entitled "of costs and fees."

### The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Fees of interpreters. SECTION 1. Section 15 of chapter 133 of the revised statutes is hereby amended, by adding at the end of said section the following: "The fees of interpreters for attending in any action or proceeding pending in a court of record, shall be two dollars and fifty cents for each day, and one dollar and twenty-five cents for each half day; and for attending in any justice's court, or before any officer, person or board authorized to take the examination of witnesses, one dollar for each day, and fifty cents for each half day, and the same fees for traveling as are by law allowed to witnesses.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
