CHAPTER 103.

[Published March 10, 1868.]

AN ACT to prohibit the superintendents of the county poor and the county board of supervisors to enter into contracts to sell or furnish provisions or other things for the use of the county poor except in an official capacity.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. No member of the county board of su certain officers pervisors or the superintendents of county poor of any not to furnish provisions for county of this state shall, except in an official capacity county poor. enter into any contract or agreement to sell, furnish or supply provisions, clothing or anything whatsoever for the use of the county poor in his respective county, nor shall any member of the said county boards of supervisors or superintendents of county poor have any pecuniary interest, direct or remote in any such contract or agreement. All contracts or agreements entered into by any member of said boards in contravention of the provisions of this section shall be void and not in any manner binding upon the said county.

Section 2. This act shall take effect from and after

its passage and publication. Approved March 4, 1868.

CHAPTER 104.

[Published March 10, 1868.]

AN ACT to amend section one of chapter 109 of the general laws of 1867, entitled "an act for the preservation of brook trout."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter 109 of general Amended. laws of 1867, is hereby amended by striking out the word "November" in the fourth line of said section, and inserting therein the word "September."

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 105.

[Published March 10, 1868.]

AN ACT to accept a grant of lands made to the state of Wisconsin by act of congress, to aid in the construction of the Sturgeon Bay and Lake Michigan ship canal and harbor, in the county of Door, to connect the waters of Green Bay with Lake Michigan, and to provide for the construction of the same.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly do enact as follows:

Grant of lands accepted.

SECTION 1. That the lands, franchises, rights, powers and privileges granted to and conferred upon the state of Wisconsin, by an act of congress, approved April 10th, 1866, "granting to the state of Wisconsin a donation of public lands to aid in the construction of a break-water and harbor and ship canal at the head of Sturgeon Bay, in the county of Door, in said state, to connect the waters of Green Bay with Lake Michigan, in said state," be and the same are hereby accepted with the restrictions and upon the terms and conditions contained in said act of congress.

Upon what company conferred. SECTION 2. For the purpose carrying out the objects of said act, the said lands are hereby granted and conferred upon the Sturgeon Bay and Lake Michigan ship canal and harbor company, a company organized in the city of Milwaukee, on the 4th day of October, 1866, under and by virtue of chapter 365 of the laws of Wisconsin of 1864, approved April 24th, 1864, subject to all the conditions, restrictions and obligations herein mentioned.

Duty of said company.

SECTION 3. It shall be the duty of said ship canal company to appoint an engineer who shall proceed to survey, lay out and establish the route of said canal, and determine the termination thereof, and also prepare a plan for the construction of said canal in conformity
