## CHAPTER 106.

[Published March 16, 1869.]

AN ACT to provide for statistics for the use of state and county boards of assessments.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :*

Assessors shall  
list personal  
property.

SECTION 1. It shall be the duty of the assessor or assessors of each town, ward or city respectively, in this state, to ascertain and set down, at the time of making the annual assessment for each year, in separate columns prepared for that purpose on the assessment roll, and opposite to the names of all persons assessed for personal property, the number and value of the following named items of personal property, owned by each such person, which value shall be the true cash value, and shall constitute the assessed valuation of the several items of property therein described, to-wit :

Items to be  
listed.

- 1st. The number and value of horses of all ages.
- 2d. The number and value of neat cattle of all ages.
- 3d. The number and value of mules and asses of all ages.
- 4th. The number and value of sheep and lambs.
- 5th. The number and value of swine.

6th. The number and value of wagons, carriages and sleighs.

7th. The number and value of gold and silver watches.

8th. The number and value of pianos and melodeons.

9th. The value of merchants, banks and manufacturers' stock.

10th. The value of all other personal property.

11th. The total value of all the personal property described as above.

SECTION 2. Upon the correction and completion of said assessment roll, as provided in section 29 of chapter 130 of the general laws of 1868, the clerks of each town, city and village respectively shall ascertain the aggregate of each of the several items specified in section one of this act, and shall, on or before the fourth Monday in August, transmit a detailed statement of the same to the clerk of the board of supervisors of their respective counties, together with a statement of the number of acres of land and the aggregate value thereof, as appears on said assessment roll.

Town and city clerks to transmit statements to clerks of boards.

SECTION 3. The clerk of the board of supervisors of each county, immediately upon the receipt of the statements, as provided in section two of this act, shall make an abstract of the same and forward it to the office of the secretary of state, on or before the second Monday in September.

Clerks of boards to forward abstract to secretary of state.

SECTION 4. Forms for assessment rolls and for the returns provided for in this chapter, shall be prescribed by the secretary of state, and shall be furnished to the assessors by the clerks of the board of supervisors of the several counties of this state.

Forms for assessment roll to be furnished by secretary of state.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
