

CHAPTER 33.

[Published March 1, 1869.]

AN ACT to prevent the setting of guns, pistols or revolvers.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Any person or persons in this state who shall hereafter set any gun, pistol or revolver, or any other firearms, for the purpose of killing deer or any other game, or for any other purpose, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined in a sum not exceeding fifty dollars, and shall be imprisoned in the county jail of the proper county for a term of not less than twenty days. Setting guns prohibited.

SECTION 2. Any justice of the peace shall have jurisdiction to hear, try and determine any action arising under this act, and it shall be the duty of all county and town officers to prosecute for any violation of this act which shall come to their knowledge. Justices shall have jurisdiction for violation of act.

SECTION 3. This act shall be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 34.

[Published February 27, 1869.]

AN ACT to amend chapter 129 of the general laws of 1867, entitled "an act to amend chapter 110 of the revised statutes, entitled 'of the registration of marriages, births and deaths.'"

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Hereafter it shall be the duty of the register of deeds of the several counties in this state to return to the secretary of state, annually, Amended—registers to make return of marriages to secretary of state.

in the month of January of each year, a copy of the record of marriages, births and deaths of the preceding year, duly certified by them, instead of semi-annually, as provided in said chapter 129 of the general laws of 1867. It shall not be deemed necessary to return a copy of the index of said returns, unless specially required by the secretary of state.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 35.

[Published March 2, 1869.]

AN ACT to authorize the secretary of state to purchase Spencer's digest of the laws of Wisconsin.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate assembly, do enact as follows:

Secretary of
state to pur-
chase Spencer's
digest for mem-
bers of legisla-
ture.

SECTION 1. The secretary of state is hereby required to purchase for the use of the legislature, any number of the digest of the laws of Wisconsin, compiled by E. A. Spencer, which can be obtained, not exceeding eighteen hundred: *provided*, the amount paid per copy shall not exceed the sum of one dollar and twenty-five cents, and the copies so purchased shall be put up in good half binding, similar to the binding of the general laws of 1868, and delivered to the members of the legislature prior to the adjournment of the present session.

Appropriation.

SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, a sum sufficient to defray the expenses authorized by this act.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
