

CHAPTER 85.

AN ACT to provide for the representation of cities and incorporated villages in county board of supervisors.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Cities and villages represented in county board.

SECTION 1. Every ward or part of a ward of any city in this state, and every incorporated village or part of an incorporated village in this state shall be represented in the board of supervisors of the county in which such ward or part of a ward of any city or incorporated village, or parts of an incorporated village is situated, by one supervisor.

Election of supervisors.

SECTION 2. Such supervisors shall be elected annually by the electors of the wards, parts of wards, villages or parts of villages respectively, to be represented by them, at the same time and in the same manner as city and village officers are elected: *provided*, that the office of supervisor shall not be incompatible with that of a member of the common council of any city or the board of trustees of any incorporated village.

Application of act.

SECTION 3. This act so far as it applies to cities and incorporated villages shall be regarded and treated as an amendment and addition to each and every charter thereof, for the purposes herein contemplated.

When to take effect.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication: *provided, however*, that the several cities and incorporated villages in this state shall continue to be represented in the boards of supervisors of the proper counties as they now are until the first Tuesday in April, A. D. 1870.
