AN ACT to amend chapter 56 of the general laws of 1869, entitled "an act to authorize the appointment of a phonographic reporter in the tenth judicial circuit of the state of Wisconsin."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section three, of chapter fifty-six of the general laws of 1869, is hereby amended by striking out the word, "seven," where it occurs in said section,

and inserting in lieu thereof the word, "ten."

Sec. 10 amend-

SECTION 2. Section ten of chapter fifty-six, as aforesaid, is hereby amended so as to read as follows: "In the trial of criminal cases the court may, in its discretion, order a transcript of the evidence and proceedings to be made, certified and audited and paid for in the same manner as the per diem compensation of such reporter, and in such cases the reporter's notes shall be written out in full and filed with the clerk of the court."

Section 3. All other acts or parts of acts conflicting with this act are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
