## CHAPTER 129.

[Published March 27, 1871.]

AN ACT to provide compensation for opening the present session and for indexing and completing the transcribing of the journal of the senate and assembly.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Appropriation SECTION 1. There is nereby appropriated. Smith, chief clerk of the senate, out of any money in dexing the senate journal of the present session, the sum of two hundred dollars, and for completing the transcribing of the senate journal the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars.

To E.W. Young.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated to E. W. Young, chief clerk of the assembly, out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, for services prior to and at the organization of the present assembly, the sum of fifty dollars; for indexing the assembly journal of the present session the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, and for completing the transcribing of the assembly journal of the present session the sum of two hundred and seventy-five dollars.

Secretary to certify.

Section 3. No money hereby appropriated shall be drawn from the treasury until the secretary of state shall certify that the duties herein provided for shall have been respectively performed.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
