

CHAPTER 139.

[Published March 29, 1871.]

AN ACT to amend section two of chapter 104 of the general laws of 1870, entitled an act to aid the West Wisconsin Railway Company.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section two of chapter 104 of the general laws of 1870 is hereby amended by striking out the word, "county," at the end of the last line, and adding thereto the words, "and Trempealeau counties." Amended.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 140.

[Published March 30, 1871.]

AN ACT relating to the settlement of the estates of deceased persons, and amendatory of section 9, chapter 98 of the revised statutes.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section nine of chapter 98 of the revised statutes is hereby amended so as to read as follows: If an executor shall neglect, after due notice given by the judge of the county court, to render his account and settle the estate according to law, or to perform any judgment of the court, or shall abscond or become insane or otherwise incapable or unsuitable to discharge the trust, the county court may remove such executor. Amended. Executors may be removed for cause.

SECTION 2. Said chapter 98 is further amended by adding thereto an additional section to read as follows: Further amended.
