## CHAPTER 203.

## [Published March 24, 1874.]

AN ACT to amend an act entitled an act to revise, consolidate and amend the act to incorporate the city of Sheboygan and the several acts amendatory thereof, and so repeal chapter nine ty-four of the private and local laws of 1856, entitled an act to establish a code of procedure for the police court of the city of Sheboygan, approved March 1, 1856, being chapter two hundred and fifty four of the private and local laws of 1868, approved March 4, 1868.

## The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Sections two (2) and four (4) of chapter Sections rethree (III) of chapter two hundred and fifty-four (254) pealed. of the private and local laws of 1868, entitled an act to revise, consolidate and amend the act to incorporate the city of Sheboygan and the several acts amendatory thereof, and to repeal chapter ninety four of the private and local laws of 1856, entitled an act to establish a code of procedure for the police court of the city of Sheboygan, approved March 1, 1856, are hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section 2. The mayor, city City officers, treasurer, city assessor, city clerk, school commission- when to be ers, city attorney, city comptroller, aldermen, justices appointed. of the peace and constables, shall be elected by the people at the annual municipal election for city and ward officers. All other officers shall be appointed by the common council at the first regular meeting thereof, after the second Tuesday of April in each year, or as soon thereafter as may be. Section 4. When any vacancy shall happen by death, resignation, removal or otherwise, in the office of mayor and justice of the peace, the same shall be filled by an election for the Any vacancy of any other city or Vacancies how unexpired term. ward officer, or such vacancy occurring otherwise than mentioned herein, the same shall be filled by appointment by the common council for the unexpired term.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
