

CHAPTER 264.

[Published March 24, 1874.]

AN ACT to authorize John H. Knapp and others to build and maintain a dam across Lightning creek, in Barron county.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. John H. Knapp, Henry L. Stout, Andrew Taintor, William Wilson, Thomas B. Wilson, and John H. Douglas and their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby authorized to construct and maintain a dam across Lightning creek (so called) in section 24, township No. 34, north of range No. 14, west of 4th meridian, in the county of Barron; said dam to be constructed for hydraulic and manufacturing purposes, and for the purpose of facilitating driving logs down said stream: *provided*, said dam shall be upon land owned by them or some of them.

Names of incorporators.

Authority to erect a dam.

Proviso.

SECTION 2. Any person or persons who shall willfully break or destroy said dam, or shall open the same, shall be liable to the proprietors thereof in an action of trespass, to the amount of damages done, in addition to the penalties already provided by law, to be recovered before any court of competent jurisdiction.

Penalty for injury to such dam.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect from and after its publication.

CHAPTER 265.

[Published March 24, 1874.]

AN ACT to authorize joint school district No. 6, of the town of Lebanon, in Dodge county, to receive its just proportion of school moneys.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Joint school district No. 6, of the town of Lebanon, in Dodge county, shall be entitled to receive its due proportion of school moneys for the years 1873 and 1874, notwithstanding the fact that no school

Shall receive its proportion of school money.
