CHAPTER 229.

[Published March 17, 1875.]

AN ACT to amend chapter 276, of the private and local laws of 1857, relating to the charter of the village of Depere.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Chapter two hundred and seventy-six (276), of the private and local laws of 1857, is hereby amended by adding after the twenty-second (22d) subdivison of section fifteen (15), of said chapter, a new subdivision to read as follows: Subdivision twenty-third (23d). To require the owners of any lot or grounds in said village, to set out ornamental required to set and shade trees in the street or streets fronting the same, and to protect and preserve them, and in default thereof to cause the same to be done and to levy a special tax upon such lot or grounds to pay the expenses of the same. The said board of trustees shall also have power to determine the lines on which trees shall be set, the places where they shall be set, the kind and size of the trees to be set, and the manner of protecting and preserving the same, and for replanting them when they have died or been so injured as to fail to answer the purpose for which they were set out. When said trees have been set out on the public grounds of the village or in front of property exempt from taxation, the expense of setting and protecting may be paid from the general fund of the village; the said board of trustees shall have full power and authority to do all other needful acts as to themselves seem just and proper to give this section full scope and effect.

Section 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
